

ORCHARDS – AN INTEGRAL PART OF THE LANDSCAPE

By cultivating orchards we help many wild plant and animal species. We enjoy their company.

Tree flowers

Serve as food for insects during the eager springtime. Our orchards are diverse with a mixture of species and varieties, and thus have a long flowering period.

Leaves

A place to catch sun from spring to autumn. Well-cultivated and airy treetops suit sun lovers.

Tree-hollow substitutions

Birds, dormice, bats, hornets or spiders – everyone appreciates a nest box. We have a solution for any housing demand.

Tree hollows

No complaints about nest boxes, but a hollow is a hollow. We protect habitat trees so that they last longer.

Old wood

Shelter and food for larvae and adult beetles. We keep some deadwood in orchards too.

Flowering plants and grassland

Food for insects from June to September
Winter accommodation from October to April. We scythe gradually, twice a year, leaving parts unmowed for winter.

Sun-exposed stones

We build rockeries for heat lovers.
